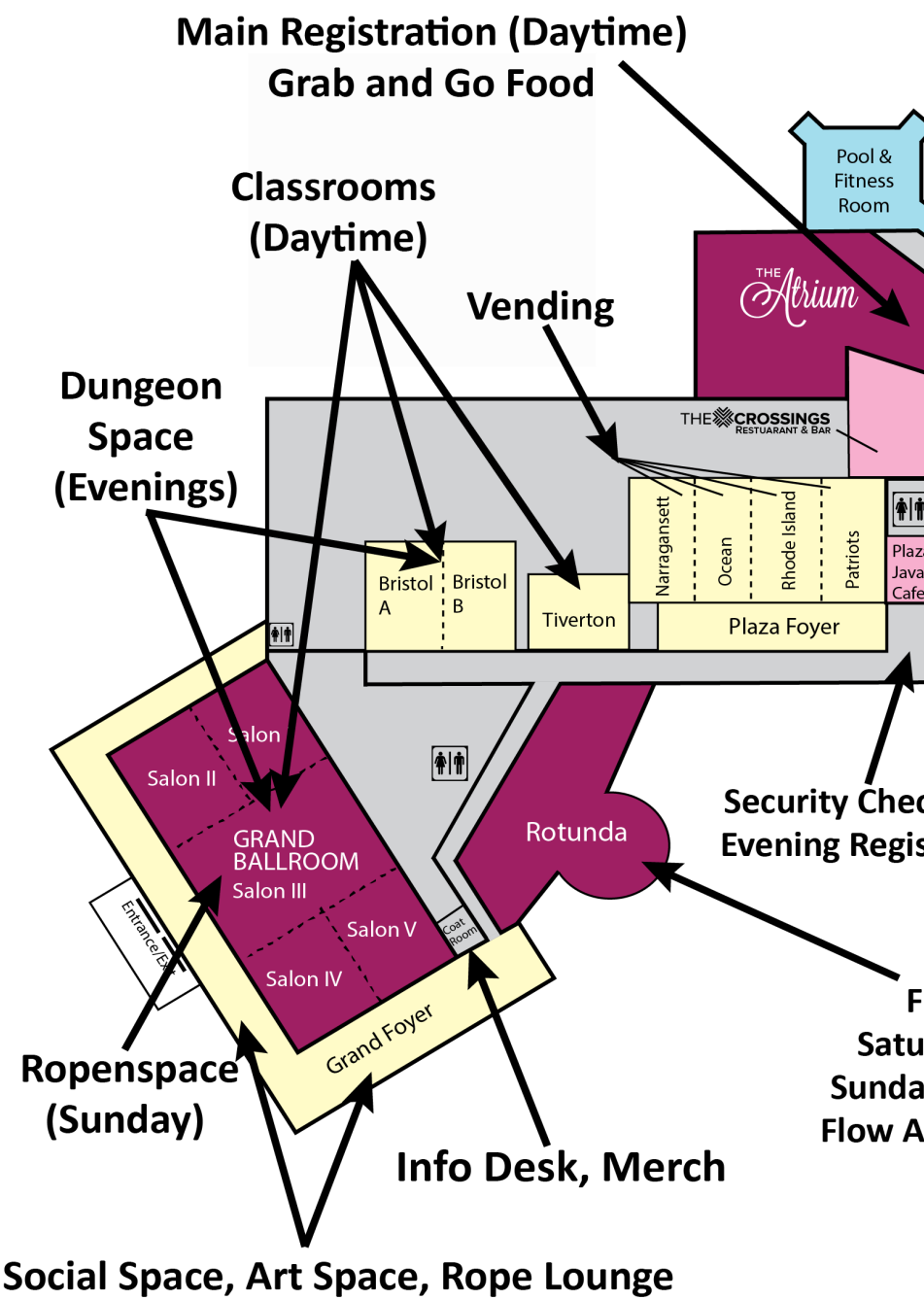

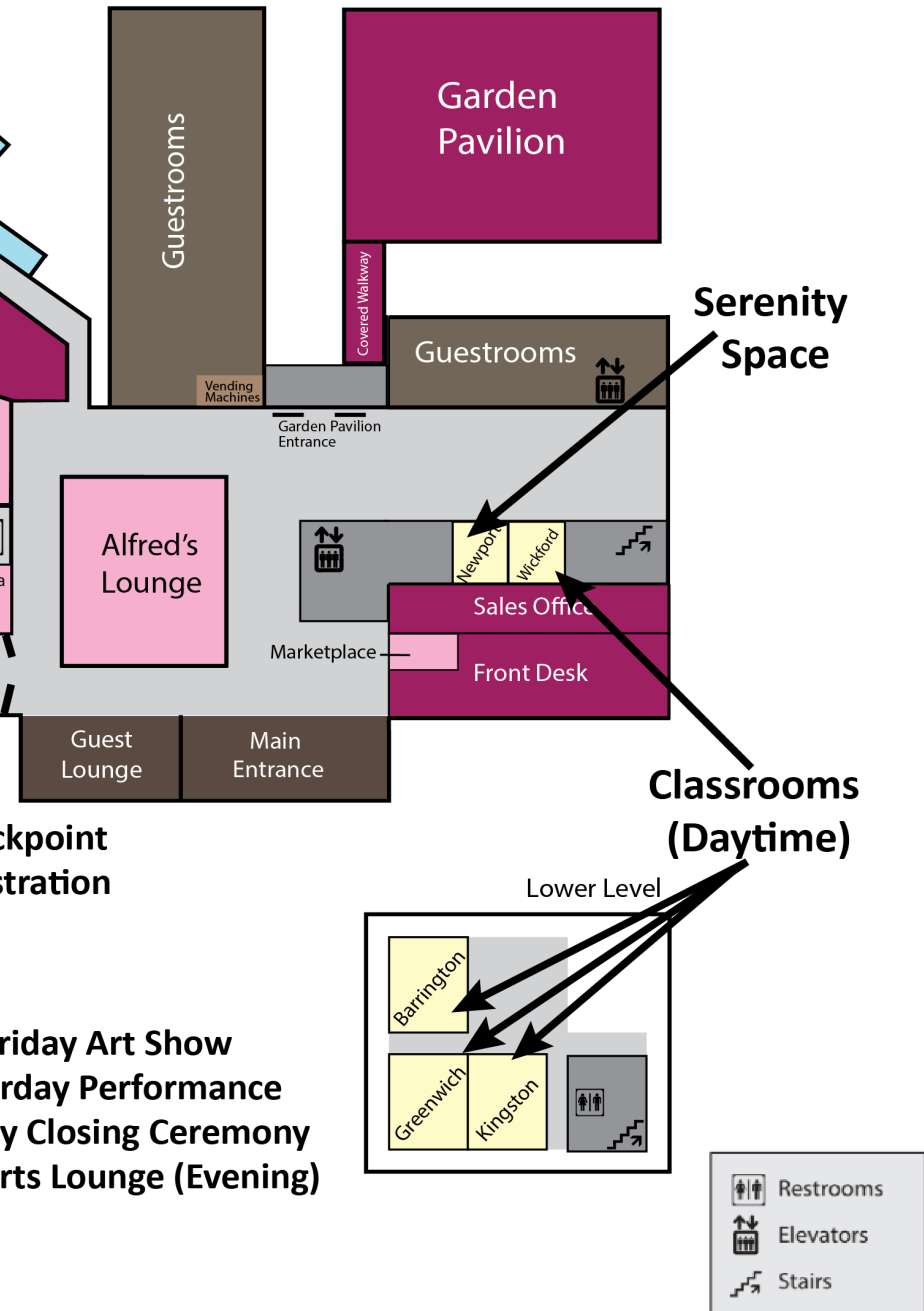

Tethered Together General Event Rules

Abuse & Harassment Policy

Attendees who use abusive language, promote a sense of unease, or in some other way impact negatively on the event or attendees at the event can be asked to leave at any time without refund. Be nice to each other, the volunteers, hotel staff and anyone that you come in contact with. Having an event in a hotel is a privilege, and if you seek to behave in a way that would reflect poorly on our group, you will be removed immediately.

Age

All Tethered Together Attendees but be at least 18 years of age by the first day of the conference. A current, valid picture ID must be presented at registration. No exceptions.

Alcohol Policy

Attendees who chose to purchase alcoholic beverages must be at least 21 years of age. Any attendee who is noticeably impaired will not be permitted to stay at the event. No drinking is allowed in the dungeon or during classes. All alcohol must stay in designated spaces.

Animals

According to the ADA, "A service animal means any dog that is individually trained to do work or perform tasks for the benefit of an individual with a disability, including a physical, sensory, psychiatric, intellectual, or other mental disability". Our hotel is a pet friendly hotel and charges a cleaning fee for overnight guests which is 50 dollars/night. Comfort/Support animal handlers must get

the hotel's permission prior to bringing an animal that is not a service animal into the hotel or conference space. Animals that are not working or providing assistance to their handler should not be inside the conference space. All service, comfort, and support animals must be updated on all vaccines, leashed, and if they have an accident - the handler should clean it immediately, and report the incident to TT staff. Handlers are completely responsible for the conduct of their animals in public and private hotel spaces including but not limited to stain removal, medical care for an attendee injured by the animal, etc.

Badges & Wristbands

Badges and wristbands must be worn at all times while in the hotel. You must wear BOTH your wristband AND your badge at all times in public event spaces. No admittance through our security checkpoints will be permitted without both wristband and badge displayed. You are expected to keep your badge with you at all times. If it is not physically on you, it must be displayed near you.

Cell Phones

Cell phones can be used to take notes during classes, but should not be used for phone conversations anywhere that would be disruptive to other attendees. Please silence your cell phone when in the conference space. This includes the sounds from typing on the keyboard, and notifications. Cell phones are not permitted to be out or used in the dungeon during parties even momentarily.

Confidentiality

All activities that take place at Tethered Together should be treated with

confidentiality. Adhere to the photography policy, and do not share information about other attendees. If you happen to see someone you know from the vanilla world - don't make it weird, and do not share that information with anyone without explicit permission. Outing an attendee is considered a serious offense and could result in your expulsion from this event, and future events.

Consent

All activity must be consensual, both in and out of play, in both actions and language. No puppy-dogging other attendees. Be respectful requesting a "yes" and providing a "no". Treat others politely when possible. (Please see consent policy for more information)

Dress Code

Hotel contracts are precious, it is important to have an incredible amount of decorum when in areas of the hotel that are not behind checkpoints. This includes ALL public areas of the hotel, including the pool. Hotel staff should not be exposed to nudity or lewd commentary. We encourage and support you dressing for your gender and personal expression. Fetish attire is okay, as long as it abides by the following requirements: Everyone's nipples, genitals, butts should always be covered when in a public area of the hotel. A sheer shirt over a bare chest is not good enough. Please be respectful of our hotel staff and the occasional Sunday guest that does not realize the hotel is full. Inside our conference space checkpoint, you may be nude. If you are going to sit on an item you do not own, please use a chux. (Please see Dress Code Policy)

Emergencies

First Aid Staff Members will be available to assist with any basic medical needs. In the event of a life-threatening emergency, call 911. Please notify event staff in the event of an emergency. DMs will be present at all parties and will serve as first responders in the event that a situation arises there.

First Aid

If you need basic first aid during our hours of operation, please ask the hospitality desk to radio for non-emergency first aid.

Hate Speech - General Hatefulness Policy

Tethered Together is designed to be a space where a variety of identities should feel safe, supported, and represented. If you use the privilege of attending the event to make hateful, discriminatory, or other just plain mean remarks about an attendee's gender, sexuality, race, religion, weight, age, economic background, etc., you might be asked to leave. You will certainly be asked to apologize. You risk not being invited to attend future events.

Photography Policy

Tethered Together does not hire official event photographers. We do allow attendees who create active consent to take photographs using their personal cell phones. Only consenting attendees may be photographed and absolutely no people who do not consent (people walking by, etc.) may be in any photographs taken even if you plan to blur or crop them out. Photography is not permitted in the dungeon during parties, and anyone

taking unsolicited photos at any time will be removed without refund. Absolutely no audio or video recording is permitted at any time within event spaces. Please limit your personal photographic equipment in general event spaces to cell phones – not larger cameras or tablets - and use good manners.

Play

Play scenes are restricted to the classrooms and playspaces. Refrain from any kind of play including pinching, fondling, spanking, rough body play, humiliation play, or similar activities while in public spaces, the Serenity Space, or in the Vendor Hall. See Dungeon Rules for play rules during evening parties.

Restrooms

Most restrooms will be all-gender for this event. Please respect the right of others to use the restroom of their choice.

Smoking

No smoking or vaping in the hotel.

Ticketing

All tickets are pre-sale. No tickets will be sold at the door. No exceptions.

Volunteers

Our volunteers are community members who have graciously given their time to help our event run more smoothly. We insist that all attendees respect volunteer directions and directives. Issues with volunteer conduct may be brought up to event management by email to info@tetheredtogether.net at any time. During our event weekend, please contact the appropriate team lead or the information desk for assistance with contacting them.

Illegal Activities

Abide by all state, local, federal laws.

Dungeon Rules

Playspace Etiquette

Respect is a cornerstone for this event. Watch scenes from a respectful distance. Avoid crowding people while they are providing/receiving aftercare. Refrain from talking loudly in the dungeon. Do not touch items that do not belong to you without permission. Never engage with a person who is playing if you are not part of that scene. This applies to all types of play including self-suspension, foot worship, and D/s.

- Avoid sitting in or otherwise blocking play-space walkways as this could create unsafe traffic flows. Do not move equipment or chairs without consent from a DM.
- Discuss and create consent prior to beginning a scene, understanding that consent can be withdrawn by any person involved at any time. See our consent guidelines for helpful negotiation tools.
- If you see something - say something. Report safety issues to DMs (Dungeon Monitors wearing reflective safety vests). Do not interrupt a scene yourself.
- Be mindful of time spent on the equipment. This is a shared space. A 45-minute time limit is suggested and will be enforced at the Dungeon Monitors' discretion. If you are planning to do multiple scenes in a row that would put you over this lim-

Dungeon Rules (Cont.)

it, please find new equipment the scene before hitting this limit.

- If your scene will involve excessive laughter, loud talking, or excessive screaming please try to select scene space away from quiet scenes currently in progress.
- Use provided cleaning supplies to wipe down equipment after use. Leave equipment free of sweat, bodily fluids, lubricants, etc. Bring spills and cleaning issues to the attention of a Dungeon Monitor.

Prohibited:

- Photography or the use of any mobile device for any purpose
- Alcohol, illegal drugs, or inhalants
- Glass bottles or other breakables
- Fire, hot wax (flame or flameless), or anything that produces smoke
- Knives
- Firearms (real or replicas)
- Urine, scat or other messy play
- Blood play, including needles, staples, or other things that penetrate the skin
- Whips and other toys longer than 6'
- Modifying dungeon furniture or bringing your own furniture
- Intentionally releasing fragrances (spraying perfumes, using incense, etc.)
- Accepting or giving payment for any type of sexual behavior/act is prohibited due to RI law.

Check in with a DM before starting if your scene involves:

- Take-downs or rough body play that might appear nonconsensual
- Political, religious, racial, or other similar topics. These may not be appropriate for our public play spaces.

Sexual Activity, Nudity, & Barriers:

We want to create an awesome, sex-pos-

itive space. To make sure the hotel will let us, we need your help making sure all fluids stay within your scene.

Please:

- Consider using gloves, condoms, and other barriers (enthusiastically encouraged but not required)
- Regardless of whether you are engaging in sexual activity, use chux between naked butts/genitals and chairs, the floor, equipment, etc. Also use chux wherever there is potential for drippage
- Place toys covered in lube or other fluids on chux, not the floor or equipment
- Use hand sanitizer after a scene before grabbing door handles, shared cleaning supplies, or other communal items

Exercise Caution:

- Playspace equipment is not designed for excessively dynamic or aggressive use. Do not swing on the frames.
- Event safeword is RED. If a DM hears RED and no communication is observed between players, the DM will check in. Call RED repeatedly and loudly if you need help from outside of your scene.
- No blood chokes, choking on the throat, or breath restriction to the point of potentially losing consciousness. Mild breath play with bare hands over the mouth or nose is allowed. Gags are permitted as long as breathing is not

significantly impaired. No toys, devices, or objects that make breathing difficult or impossible.

- Read the equipment info card attached to dungeon furniture before using it. Consult a DM with questions.

Consent and Conduct Policy

Consent Philosophy

Consent is collaborative. You're not doing stuff TO people, you're doing stuff WITH people. If you'd like to play with someone else, you need talk about what you want to do before you do it and find something to do together. That could be lots of things or nothing. Both are okay to find out. We suggest you consider talking about how you want to feel after you're done as well. If you can't talk about it together, you probably shouldn't be doing it together.

Consent Policy

1. No touching people or personal property without permission.
2. Treat everyone as an equal, and only engage in verbal role-play if you have permission. For example, don't call someone as "Mistress" or "slave" or any other role-play word unless you've asked for permission.
3. Determine the scope of your scene prior to the activities, including whether there will be any contact with the breasts and genitals. Consent must be established before play and may be withdrawn at any time by anyone involved for any reason.
4. Each participant is responsible for making sure everyone involved has the mental and emotional ability to give informed and voluntary consent for the scene.
5. Depending on all participants' state of mind, we recommend that you don't renegotiate in the middle of your scene. When a person is in subspace or otherwise not in a clear state of mind, you may not have informed consent even though that person may appear to agree in the heat of the moment.
6. Anyone can withdraw consent, make a nonverbal safesign or use the universal safeword "Red" at any time during a scene. Once consent is withdrawn, the activity must stop immediately. Partners need to share the safewords or safe-signs that are being used.
7. The person performing an action on someone else is legally responsible for stopping that action at any suggestion that the person they are doing the action to has withdrawn consent or that consent has not been established for that action. The person receiving an action is ethically responsible for being clear and unequivocal when withdrawing consent or communicating that consent has not been established.
8. If you experience or witness a consent incident, tell a DM or clearly marked delegate of the event organizer immediately.
9. Violation of this consent policy may result in expulsion from the event or group. No one is

exempt from the rules.

10. Disclaimer: Every reasonable effort will be made to enforce this policy, but this organization makes no representations or guarantees about its ability to do so, and all participants/attendees retain full, sole responsibility for their own safety and, ethically and often legally, the safety of others with whom they interact.

Consent Incident Help

If you would like to speak to a Peer Support volunteer about a consent incident, please find a staff member at the Help Desk or Registration. Ask them to contact a member of the Peer Support Team. You do not have to share the reason with anyone. You are welcome to share the experiences that you are comfortable sharing with whom you wish to speak with.

A Peer Support Team member will meet you and provide a listening ear. If you opt to file an official incident report form, they will provide that information to you. Although reports are not anonymous, they are confidential. In certain cases, the team will want to share the nature of the concern with Skyla & Ozma so that appropriate actions can be taken to provide a safe and comfortable environment for you and the other attendees.

We have enlisted the help of Susan Wright from the National Coalition for Sexual Freedom. Susan will be on call for the entire event to provide

our Peer Support volunteers with compassionate and informed advice if a challenging situation arises.

Dress Code

Our having a space to do what we do depends on our conduct and one inconsiderate person can ruin it for everybody.

We expect everyone to be street legal and public-level polite in ALL hotel public spaces including riding the elevators and walking to their guest rooms.

We encourage and support you dressing your gender how you feel most comfortable. Your fetish wear is fine too. Wearing only a thong and electrical tape and holding a sex toy in each hand in the hotel restaurant or while checking in at the hotel front desk is NOT FINE. People not associated with the con will be coming in and out to deliver mail, and that's both putting your naked butt on things you don't own (DO NOT DO THIS) and exposing the vanillas to your great kinky sex life (DO NOT DO THIS EITHER).

Dress in Hotel Public Spaces

DO: Be polite, street-legal and public-polite and hold kink-related conversations in kink-friendly spaces. *Check the elevator for vanillas before talking about that one time with the leeches.*

Dress Code (Cont.)

In Hotel Public Spaces

DO NOT: Display genitals (real or simulated - this means no dildo parades, see-through latex or mesh (without a cover-up), play in public spaces (no leading on leashes etc.). Be an abassador of kinky people so we can come back next year.

Dress After Security Checkpoint

After our security checkpoint, expectations relax significantly. Dress code is fetish friendly in hallways and vending areas but our window coverings are imperfect so we expect street legal (risque ok!) in our hallways. Nudity is OK in our classrooms and dungeons but folks need to be sitting on blankets/towels/yoga mats/chux/etc. and not right on hotel furnishings or carpet if they are significantly undressed. It's probably self-evident to say "no naked genitals on hotel furnishings EVER" but being blunt about it now will hopefully avoid awkward conversation later. We don't want to have to talk to anyone about that any more than anyone wants to get talked to about that.

Final Words on Rules and Conduct

"Shocking the normals" might be funny to some folks, but it's very much not to us and it damages our reputation in a real way. One jackwagon* can screw it up for everybody, friends. Don't be that person. Our ability to have spaces to gather depends on a culture of mutual respect between our group and our hosts. Thanks for your help keeping the magic alive!

* For those of you not from the Northeast, jackwagon is a colloquial term for an inconsiderate thoughtless person who would cause your hosts to lose their hotel contract and us to all have nowhere to party. Less polite terms are also available (see Ozma for list)
